APO holds semi-annual blood drive;

O negative blood requested for soldier

The spring blood drive conducted by Alpha Phi Omega, national service fraternity, will be held at Monmouth College Thursday, April 29.

The group holds semi-annual drives each year. The blood will be collected in the Versailles Room of Woodrow Wilson Hall, the college's main building, between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m., by the American Red Cross Bloodmobile, New York-New Jersey Region.

A special request for 0-negative blood has been made for a soldier at Fort Monmouth. Without it he may die.

Blood donated during the local drive will provide for the blood needs of all donors and their immediate families for one year, according to Mark Sedler, Clifton, a junior majoring in

Business Administration, who is serving as drive chairman.

APO members will staff tables in the main building and in the Student Union for pro-

spective donors to sign up in advance. Students between the ages of 18 and 21 must have their application signed by a parent or guardian.

An added feature, the chairman said, is that if 50 per cent of fraternity, sorority, faculty group, administrative group or residence hall organization contribute to the local appeal, all the members of the organization, as well as members of the donor's families will be covered.
