The point is: the present Draft is intolerable, but much of that embodied in the volunteer army is of far worse consequence.

Both the right and the left make a good case of the unconstitutionality of the present system and both point up the hasic need in a democratic society to be able to have a free choice. But what has not been done is the extension of the democratic process to the point where every citizen is confronted with the opportunity to serve his country. The government would demand it as a basic duty but leave the actual choice as to how up to the individual not to soem old men on the local draft board. How can we fight for democracy in Vietnam if it does not exist here?This may be one of the most democratic nations in the world but that does not say it is democratic. What the volunteer army represents is a repackaging of the same old tired concept and it just does not hold up.
