## Joint effort seen in Nov. Moratorium

Many activities, affiliated with both Monmouth College and the local community, are being planned for the November 14th Vietnam Peace Offensive. Student Moratorium Committee of Monmouth College (S.M.C.) has been encompassed by the larger Vietnam Moratorium Committee (V.M.C.) The V.M.C. composed of two representatives of any campus organization which wishes to sponsor an activity on the 14th. Such groups as the Students for an Educated Society, the Black Students Union and the S.M.C. are represented. The purpose of the November Offensive is once again to voice public dissent over the war in Vietnam and the policies being presently maintained by the Nixon Administration.

A tentative schedule for November 14th has been proposed by the V.M.C. A rally will be held at 11:00 a.m. on the Student Union steps, consisting of music, dramatic productions, and speakers. The rally will conclude with an on-campus march. Another march, centered on Fort Monmouth, is being anticipated, with a departure point to be announced. The community and all high students are invited to attend these events. Additionally, Peace Brigades comprised Monmouth College students and faculty will be sent to the community to arouse public support and distribute literature. Speakers will be sent to various local organizations and high schools at their request. Friday

evening (the 14th) a mass rally will be held at 8:00 p.m. in the gym.

The V.M.C. is sponsoring buses to Washington, D.C. for the massive anti-war march to be held on Saturday, November 15th. Buses will leave Friday around midnight. The round-trip price is \$7.50, and reservations are now being taken in the Great Hall, Woodrow Wilson. Further information may be obtained by calling 222-1096 or 229-7869.

Locally, there will be a talk and discussion about other American military involvements in Asia, entitled "After Vietnam, What?" The lecture will be presented at the Ocean Township Recreation Center at 8 p.m. on Sunday, November 9. On Friday, the 14th, there will be a motorcade and the signing of a petition urging "End the War, President Nixon!" Interested persons should call Debby Jacoby at 222-2673. The time scheduled is 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. At 8 p.m. the same day there will be a "Performers for Peace" rally in the college gym. This will be a main Moratorium event in the county. There is no admission fee and the public is invited. Finally, on Saturday the 15th, from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m., there will be a vigil held at the Quaker Meeting House on Route 35 in Shrewsbury. Again, all are invited to participate in this solemn ceremony for the war dead.
