

Model United Nations Set For One Week from Today

The Fourth Annual Model United Nations sponsored by the MC Student Government Association will convene on Friday, April 23. There will be 40 delegation representatives of 24 high schools from all parts of New Jersey in attendance. The executive committee, under the leadership of Harold J. Hodes, has fully outlined the proceedings for the weekend.

During these sessions the student delegations are given the opportunity to express opinions, propose resolutions and debate problems which may or may not be in accordance with their own viewpoints. These high school students must be cognizant of and in accordance with the political, social, and economic position of the country they represent. In so doing the students receive ample opportunity not only to familiarize themselves with the problems of a particular country but also to attain a broader perspective into world affairs.

The Advisory Committee for the Model United Nations is headed by such notables as the Honorable Adlai E. Stevenson and the Honorable Richard J. Hughes. The Executive Committee for MUN, composed of MC students, includes Harold Hodes, director; Richard

Towers, co-director; Jacqueline York, executive secretary; Henry L. Schwartz, director of public relations; Thomas Byrne, delegation director; Dave Edwards, executive assistant; Charles Tra bold, ex officio director. The officials participating directly in the MUN proceedings and regulating the agenda are Secretary General, John L. Winterstella; President of the General Assembly, Richard Napoli; President of the Security Council, George Alzenaur. George Caldwell, George Allgor and Micheal Fisher will act as Parliamentarians, while Kenneth Rocky, assisted by Judy Wasser, is the Director of Communications.

While gathered in facsimile General Assembly and Security Council sessions the delegations will have the opportunity to listen to talks by noted authorities associated with the United Nations. Paul Gimes, diplomatic reporter to the UN for the **New York Times** will present a comprehensive survey of major international issues. On the agenda for Saturday is the internationally known personality, Tran van Dinh, former Ambassador of Vietnam in the United States who will speak to the assemblage on "The War in Vietnam."
