

Prof. Greenberg to face Appellate Committee

Michael Greenberg, professor of history whose contract was not renewed for next year, will present his case Wednesday to the Appellate Committee composed of eight faculty members.

Greenberg, who gained notoriety for his participation in the "Maxwell Taylor Incident" of last May, is appealing his case to the body in attempts to reverse the decision made by the senior members of his department last November.

At the time of the announcement, Greenberg said that his department's decision not to renew his contract was due to administrative pressure placed on the department.

The firing of Greenberg and two other professors, Vincent Renda and Arthur S. Weinberg, both of the business department, was on cause of a student movement last

November which charged the administration with intimidating and pressuring the faculty. The movement resulted in the creation of the present Task Force.

The Faculty Appellate Committee, elected by the faculty members, consists of Chairman Albert E. Friedman, Department of Sociology, Robert M. Rechnitz, English Department, James Flanagan, English department, Guy B. Oakes, Philosophy Department, Thomas Reiter, English Department, Leonard E. Spiegel, Biology Department, and Tommy Tucker, Fine Arts Department. Kenneth Stunkel, Department of History, who normally sits on this committee, will, for this hearing, be replaced by Reiter.

Recommendations of the Appellate Committee are not binding.
