

SMC sets plans for anti-war activities

The Student Moratorium Committee has finalized its plans for anti-war activities next week, beginning with a march in Red Bank tomorrow.

Ruben Williams, a spokesman for the group, said the Red Bank march will take place in front of the Bell Telephone company office to protest the fact that Bell, as a subsidiary of American Telephone & Telegraph, is the second largest profit maker on the Vietnam war.

On Monday, the group is

showing a film, "Vietnam; How Did We Get Into It, And How Do We Get Get Out?" It will be shown in the Student Union Annex at 7:30 p.m. There will be no admission charge.

On April 15, The S.M.C., in conjunction with Education for Peace, will picket the Internal Revenue Service office in Asbury Park, to protest war taxes spent in Vietnam.

The group is also discussing having guerilla theater, speakers, and a student strike on the

fifteenth. These activities will all be tied in with national anti-war activities called the Spring Offensive to end the War In Vietnam. The group has been in contact with S.M.C. headquarters in New York City, and is working with them to coordinate plans here at Monmouth.

Nationally, S.M.C. is calling for a three day fast beginning April 13, to demonstrate their concern for war victims and determination to end the war.
